What is Agriculture?

Definition: Agriculture has traditionally been described as the science, art, and business of cultivating soil, producing crops, and raising livestock – also known as farming. However, agriculture, like the rest of the world, is evolving and changing, resulting in new and different careers. Far from being a dying aspect of the labour market, agriculture – or agriculture business, as it is currently known – offers job seekers the opportunity to develop new skills or to enhance and transfer skills they already have. Agricultural business is about how food gets from the field to the table. It examines the financing, marketing, and management of food production and the economic theories and influences behind the buying and selling of food. You might be surprised to learn how many different types of careers fall under the umbrella of agriculture!

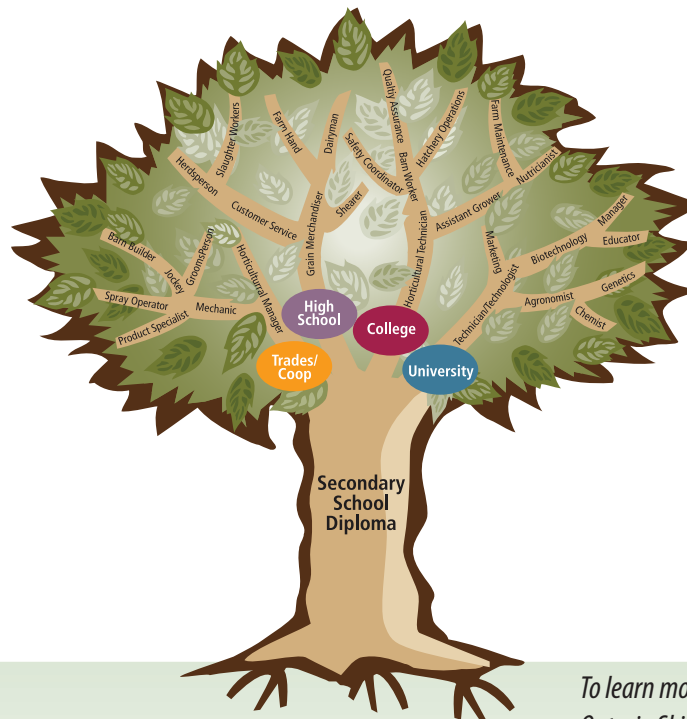

Graphs, lists, tables, blueprints, schematics, drawings, signs and labels.
- 3. Numeracy**
Use numbers and quantitative terms.
- 4. Writing**
Text, documents or computer typing.
- 5. Oral Communications**
Give and exchange thoughts and information.
- 6. Working with Others**
Working co-operatively with others. Self-discipline to meet work targets.
- 7. Continuous Learning**
Participating in acquiring skills and knowledge.
- 8. Thinking Skills**
Problem solving, decision making, critical thinking, job task planning and organizing, and ability to find information.
- 9. Computer Use**
The variety and complexity of computer use.
