- c. has resided, worked, travelled outside Canada in excess of 180 days in the last ten years;
- d. has immediate relatives who are currently residing outside of Canada.

Advise the applicant that a Pre-Assessment can sometimes take from 6 to 18 months to complete depending on the number of countries that must be contacted and the willingness and/or ability of some countries to provide the

information sought.
