What is the OPA?


- Created in 2004 by the Ontario government, began operations in 2005
- Mandate is to ensure reliable, long-term electricity supply for Ontario
- Responsible for:
 - developing the Integrated Power System Plan
 - leading conservation initiatives
 - ensuring investment in new supply
 - facilitating development of electricity sector



Conservation Fund – Secondary School Co-op in Energy Efficiency

The OPA's Conservation Strategy


- Three-pronged strategy to achieve 6,300 MW by 2025
- Current emphasis is on incentive-driven programs (buying MW) with strong OPA role in program management
- Future emphasis to be on integrating capability building and market transformation into incentive driven program to enable more permanent shift in consumer behaviour
- Conservation Fund = innovative, integrated approaches to electricity conservation programs




Conservation Fund - Overview

Fund Objectives

- 1. Build marketplace capability for the design, delivery, marketing and uptake of conservation programs
- 2. Test new or unique conservation program elements
- 3. Results from pilots inform future programs and next portfolio
- Since inception in 2005, 57 projects totalling \$6.8m in OPA support
- Projects have leveraged over \$11m in external contributions
- \$3m/yr available for 2008 commitments
- Fund provides up to \$400,000/project

Capability Building within the Conservation Fund

 Conservation Fund is one avenue for OPA to ensure workforce capable of meeting electricity conservation targets
Current situation:

Long-term provincial conservation targets

- + Forecasted lack of specially trained work force
- + Limited student awareness of opportunities
- Conservation Fund Call for EOIs







Conservation Fund Opportunity

- Project funding between \$50k and \$400k
- CF project support can last up to 2 years
- Proponent must provide necessary academic infrastructure and at least 50% of the co-op teacher's salary
- Best practices for CF projects:
 - Develop ongoing capability for conservation after the project is completed
 - Realistic goals and measurable results
 - Collaborate with sector partners
 - Leverage other funding and resources (recommended 50% minimum)
 - Promote and enable action, not simply awareness




Call for EOIs

- Conservation Fund released the Call in August
- Currently seeking interested schools/school boards or other delivery agents working in the topic area to apply
- Projects work with co-op program to give students opportunity to work in this sector
- Some possible co-op types:
 - Energy auditing
 - Building system management
 - Electrical engineering/contracting
 - Energy and public policy



Important Project Elements

- Support from students, employers, schools/boards
- Skill development
- Links with colleges, universities, trades that create follow-on opportunities
- Replicable project model:



Not of interest:

- Projects focusing exclusively on conservation awareness
- Projects unique to one community with limited potential for replication
