UNLOCKING THE MYSTERIES OF MATH: Bateman High School...

S ome students at Robert Bateman High School came up with their own solution to the problem of how to help teach math to fellow students

Bateman's Grade 12 International Baccalaureate (IB) math class, with the aid of its teachers, devised a series of hands-on activities to engage the entire complement of the school's Grade 9s who are in preparations to write the standardized provincial math test.

The IB students organized and staged a numeracy initiative last month at the New Street school, the first annual Pi-tastic Piathalon, to prepare the Grade 9s for the Education Quality and Accountability Office (EQAO) math

It's mandatory for all Grade 9 academic/applied math pupils to write the EQAO test as their final math exam requirement; it will take place in late

A group of Grade 11 students at Robert Bateman H. S. are collecting books of all kinds to benefit some impoverished schools in the African country of Uganda.

The book drive is being run by Jeremiah Witt, Gina Markle, LaShawn Murray and Sakie Obata with the assistance of fellow students Warren Goodwin, Devon Ryan and Devon Bartlett.

"A civil war has been going on (sporadically) in Uganda since 1987, and the saddest part of this war is that a large percentage of the rebel army (Lord's Resistance Army) is composed of children that are abducted from their homes and forced to take part," said Witt.

He said the idea for the book drive was spawned by a presentation made at his church by the humanitarian organization Invisible Children.

"I was moved by that," said Witt, noting the book drive is a student-run initiative not connected to any club at the school.
