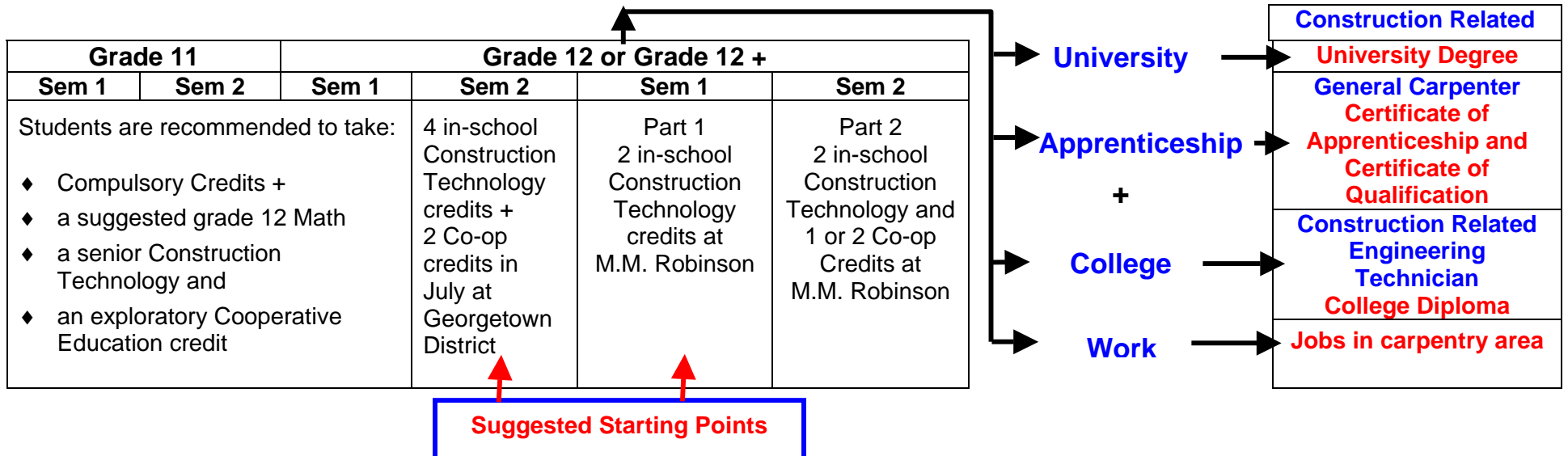


# Carpenter and Cabinetmaker Concentrated OYAP Pathways



Please note: Any students wanting to pursue College, University or for those that wish to combine either College or University with an Apprenticeship, must take the appropriate admission required University, University/College or College destination pre-requisite courses.

## What is an Apprenticeship?

In an Apprenticeship, students ...

- may earn while they learn.
- will be taught one on one by a certified carpenter/cabinetmaker.
- will be sent to take apprenticeship courses at college.
- will have the government pay approximately 80% of their tuition.
- will have the opportunity to turn a blue collar job into a "gold" collar career.

## Why consider Concentrated OYAP?

In Concentrated OYAP students ...

- may shorten their apprenticeship.
- may get their foot in the door with a potential employer.
- may complete their first level of in-school apprenticeship training.
- may save thousands of dollars on similar courses offered at colleges and private vocational training centres.
- who graduate from a Concentrated OYAP program may still attend college or university if they have the entrance requirements.

## What other training will I receive?

In Carpenter, Cabinetmaker Concentrated OYAP students will have the opportunity to earn the following additional certifications or awareness in:

- Standard First Aid
- Adult CPR
- Young Worker Awareness

In addition to the above, students will also have the opportunity to earn Construction Safety Association of Ontario (CSAO) Certifications or awareness in:

- Health and Safety Basic
- Fall Protection
- Construction WHMIS

## What is Concentrated OYAP?

- Carpenter, Cabinetmaker Concentrated OYAP is specifically designed to help secondary school students make a smooth transition directly into the post-secondary apprenticeship program.
- Concentrated OYAP allows secondary school students to begin their post-secondary Carpenter or Cabinetmaker Apprenticeship while still in Secondary School.
- Concentrated OYAP is also designed to help prepare students for academic success in the apprenticeship courses usually taught at college.
- M.M. Robinson and Georgetown are the only two schools in Halton, which offer these excellent programs.
- Concentrated OYAP provides students with the opportunity to complete the first level of in-school apprenticeship training while still in high school.
- Similar courses are offered at both colleges and private vocational training facilities, at a much higher cost.
